Role of the Advisor

The Student Conduct Code affords all students involved in the University judicial process the right to an advisor. The term advisor means any one person chosen by the charged student or the alleged victim to assist him/her throughout the disciplinary process. Regardless of who a student chooses to advise him/her, the advisor **cannot** speak for a student in the hearing unless authorized by the hearing body. However, a student may consult with his/her advisor at any time during the hearing. This consultation must take place in a manner that does not disrupt the proceedings. A student's advisor must not be connected to the actual judicial case or a related case. In addition, an advisor may not serve as a witness.
